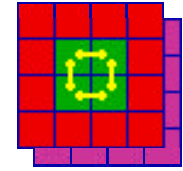

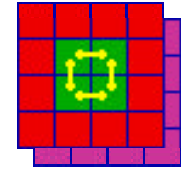

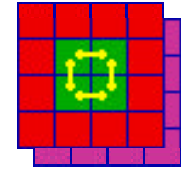
# Synchronicity demo



- o Richard Lawrence, Paul Hardy of RAL MSC
- o Features
  - o Single repository (Vault) server – usually UNI X
  - o Client access local, UK-wide and international – UNI X/Linux/PC
  - o Design Sync – main repository access GUI
    - o But also integrated with Mentor HDL Designer
  - o Project Sync – web based project management tool
- o Demo
  - o Simple design check in/out of system, and modified
  - o File upload/download was rather slow
- o Cost
  - o Use RAL server – already available
  - o 480 Euros per licence up to 10
  - o 300 Euros thereafter
  - o 50 Euros remote site licence for client access



# MY Conclusions



- It's an archiving system
  - IMHO, no worse or better than another
  - as long as speed we saw is not normal
- It's cheap
  - but not free, unlike, say CVS
- Basic HD is well integrated
  - What about 'side files' ?
    - Note: proposed change to pin layout for CP serialiser
- It's already available at RAL, so might as well use it here
  - But how do we convince others to use it?
