
Subscriptions

- Enterprise Linux products are delivered on an annual Subscription basis
- One price covers everything
 - Product (binary and source CDs) & documentation
 - Upgrades customers get new releases at no extra charge
 - Maintenance Red Hat Network delivers updates and errata (ex. security & bug fixes)
 - Remedial services up to 24x7 with 1 hr response & unlimited calls
 - Customers can choose from multiple price points for different SLAs
- No Client Access Licenses
- Predictable, Predictable Budget = no surprises
- Volume discounts Multi-Year Agreements

Enterprise Linux Release Model

- Extended development of new releases
 - 12-18 month release cycle RHEL 2.1 released in 4/02 and RHEL 3 to be released in 10/03, RHEL 4 targeted for 10/04
 - Software/Hardware Partners and Customers involved in alpha/beta tests delivered through Red Hat Network (RHN)
 - 5-year support life cycle
- Regular, consolidated updates provided during product lifetime:

Available via RHN plus full ISO respins


Approximately every 3-6 months

- Bug fixes
- Minor enhancements
- Support for New hardware





Enterprise Linux Lifecycle



- Three Phases of Support
 - Full Support: Update Releases, bug fixes, security fixes
 - Deployment: bug fixes, security fixes
 - Maintenance: critical bug fixes, security fixes
- Update Releases
 - Released every 3-6 months for during Full Support
 - Update releases include
 - Updated hardware support, including new installer
 - Cumulatively published errata

The Fedora Project

- Launched in September 2003 at http://fedora.redhat.com
- Community-driven and community-supported project to replace Red Hat Linux consumer product line (RHL 7.2, 8.0, V9, etc...)
- Proving-ground for new technology that may eventually end up in Red Hat Enterprise Linux
- Not a Red Hat product an open-source project
 - No support available from Red Hat
 - Driven by steering-committee, not Red Hat revenue constraints
